

1986 – this year the 1st European Notary Football Championship was held in Lindabrunn, Austria. Besides the host, the neighbors - Germany and Italy - took part, but the host just won a historic victory.

This year the European Notary Football Championship will take place in Cracow, for the first time in Poland. Cracow will also have its own Euro 2012 says satisfied Czesław Szynalik, the main organizer of the event.

- Austrian notaries started their football struggles in 1974 - reminds Dr. Franz Leopold, a notary from Graz. On the football field came representatives of five states of Austria. This is how the idea of annual national football tournaments was born. Some time later the idea had

been developed: we invited colleagues from other notary chambers. Dr. Franz Leopold who is an Austrian member of the Board of Directors of the International Union of Latin Notaries made another step forward: he agreed conditions of the first international game.

- We played against our Italian friends reminds Dr. Leopold. Sergio Parisio from Bologna set out the organization of the game - he adds. It was held on October 6th, 1984 at the Military Stadium in Florence, parallel to a conference of the International Union of Latin Notaries. Though we was fighting in heavy rain, the day turned out to be very sunny for the Austrian team: we won against our friends from Italy 6:0 – says Dr. Leopold.

Two years later the 1st European Notary Football Championship took place in Lindabrunn, Austria. Teams of notaries from Austria, Italy and Germany took part in it. In 1987 Spain and the Netherlands, and within the following years also Belgium, France and the Czech Republic, joined the tournament. During the last 27 years the Italian team has won the most times – informs scrupulous Thomas Grauel. Notaries from Italy have stood on the winner's podium 9 times, the Austrian team has gained 7 wins, the French one 4 wins, the Spanish one 3 wins, the Belgian one 2 wins and notaries from Germany has won the tournament once.

The first time notaries from Poland played a match at the tournament was in 2009. We made our debut in eighth place – reminds Czesław Szynalik, the main organizer of the European Notary Football Championship in Poland. Two years later, in 2011, the Polish team stood in the eighth place again, and... we decided to invite our friends to the most wonderful place in the world, the magic Cracow says Czesław Szynalik.

Austrian notaries who were the founders of the European Championship, are not only excellent professionals but also brilliant football players. They could be regarded as the best example for their national football team. As many as 7 times they were the best players of the European Championship. For the first time they triumphed in the first tournament in Lindabrunn in 1986. Later they were the champions in 2001–2004 and 2006–2007. Perhaps this year in Cracow they are going to score their 8th victory.

Their adventure with the European Championship Belgian notaries started in 1988 in Augsburg – then they were the third. 3 years later in Brussels they were already celebrating the first victory. The next time they won in Marbella in 2005. But it should be mentioned that twice they were very close to be the winners – in 1998 in Prague that team was just after Italian notaries and in 1999 in Antwerp only Spanish were better.

SPANISH Team



Vienna, Rimini and Antwerp – those are the cities which are the best associated by the Spanish notaries. Since exactly there they won in 1993, 1994 and 1999. They also were the second in Veronela in 2010 and in Nuremberg in 2011, and bronze medals were won in Seville in 1990 and in Palm in 1997. During two last championships they were beaten only by Italian colleagues. That is why in Cracow this team is considered to be the favourite to win the championship.

As for now French notary team has won the European Championship 4 times. For the first time that team was the winner in Seville in 1990, later they were the best in the final in Nuremberg (1995), in Palma (1997) and in Graz (2009). Generally during those 23 years they were the second 3 times – in Den Haag (1989) where they started their football adventure, in Rimini (1994) and Maastricht (1996), as well as they were on the third place twice in Montpellier (1992) and Veronello (2010).

GERMAN Team

German notaries – together with Austrian and Italian colleagues – have been taking part in the European Championship from the very beginning. In 1986 in Lindabrunn they were the third. A year later in Verona they were the second. The most successful for them was the tournament in Augsburg in 1988 where they won the main title. They were the second for 5 times – in Verona (1987), Nuremberg (1995) , Munich (2003) , Den Haag (2004) and Graz (2009). This team won also the third position for 4 times – that was in Lindabrunn, Salzburg (2001), Padua (2002) and Marbella (2005).

Italian notaries have been taking part in the European Football Championship since 1986. In the first tournament in Lindabrunn they were the second. A year later – in Verona – they didn't give any chances to rivals. As many as 9 times they were on the top place of the podium including two last years. (They were the second for 7 times and twice they were on the lowest place of the podium). That is why it is not surprising that they are said to be ones of the favourites on the Stadium of Hutnik.

Royal City of Cracow




Cracow is not just one of the oldest but also one of the most beautiful cities in Poland. The other days Cracow was a residence of princes, kings and a state capital. Today this is a charming city with wonderful monuments and a magic atmosphere. When you come to Cracow you fell in love with it for sure. The first place where people have settled in was the defensive Wawel, where now erects a castle (on the picture). The first reference about Cracow stems from the X age. On June 5th, 1257 prince Bolesław V Bashful classified the city a document. In the cathedral overlooked on the Wawel hill in 1320 took place coronation of Władysław Łokietek. In 1978 the Old City has been inscribed on the I List of Cultural and Natural Heritage UNESCO. - This is a city of my life - that was about the City of Cracow said Jan Paweł II, pope. Tourists, crowned heads, presidents, prime ministers still gladly come to Cracow although Cracow is not the capital of Poland. The city will turn into a Capital of the European Notariat for four days in May.

Underground treasures of Wieliczka



The salt mine in Wieliczka glories in one thing – it is the only mining object in the whole world over, that is active without a break since Middle Age up till now. This is just one of many reasons to immerge under the ground world of almost 300 km pavements, charming chambers, impressive chapels (on the picture Holy Kinga's Chapel), salty lakes, extraordinary technology monuments and wonderful works of art. Over the ages under the City of Wieliczka hollowed out a dark labyrinth dining into 327 m immerge under the ground. UNESCO has inscribed the Salt Mine in Wieliczka on the I List of Cultural and Natural Heritage UNESCO (September 8th, 1978). There is nothing special about it that the place visit even over a million of tourists every year.

↑ The Island Beskids is one of the most beautiful mountain ranges in Poland in addition with still a lot of secrets and mysteries. Mysterious is its name for the beginning. Why is it called the island? It is quite easy to answer that question at the crack of dawn when the mist is spanning over the valleys. And then lonely, lovely islands are looming out of it. The queen of them is Mogielica. Other major peaks include Luboń Wielki, Ćwilin, Jasień, Śnieżnica, Księża Góra, Szczebel, Łopień, Kostrza, Sałasz, Lubogoszcz and Potaczkowa. Besides wonderful microclimate, springs of refreshing water, picturesque forests and very rich history. Mszana Dolna, the capital of the Island Beskids, is well-known to the notaries from all over Europe, as for the 11 years the Notary Olympics has been organized in this town.



KRAJOWA RADA NOTARIALNA

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Notaries have had their holiday in Mszana Dolna for the last 11 years. The Notary Olympics are being held here. This year 435 notaries from Poland, Russia, Ukraine, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Slovakia, Turkey and Hungary will take part in the Olympics. Notaries will compete in 40 kinds of sport, i.e. running, jumping, football, volleyball, basketball, swimming, tennis on the stadium of Jan Ciszewski in Mszana Dolna, in the sports hall, on tennis courts and in the swimming pool.
